### Milken Educator Award winner Emily Litz recognized by NJ State Board of Education

Nettingham fifth-grade teacher Emily Litz continued to bring pride to Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools. On May 7, she was formally recognized by the New Jersey State Board of Education (NJSBOE) for winning the Milken Educator Award, often referred to as the 'Oscar's of Teaching'.

"We recognize you. We value you and we thank you," said NJSBOE Division of Teaching and Learning Services Assistant Commissioner Dr. Jorden Schiff. Other NJSBOE members also spoke about how Litz is a dedicated teacher who worked hard to earn this recognition and how she is a "bright light" in the teaching profession.

The Milken Family Foundation honors 45 teachers nationwide every year, and in 2024 Litz was the sole winner in New Jersey. #### Board of Education seeks applicants to fill vacancy for Fanwood

The Board of Education is seeking a new board member to fill a vacancy following the resignation of Amy Winkler, effective June 1, 2025. This qualified applicant from Fanwood would serve until the next annual school election in November 2025.

Qualified residents interested in being considered for this appointment must submit a letter of interest and resume by **3 p.m. Friday, June 6, 2025** to Board Secretary Christopher Jones (313 South Ave, Suite 200, Fanwood, NJ 07023; cjones@spfk12.org). The letter should outline the candidate's qualifications, reasons for seeking appointment and what they believe they would contribute to the district.

Formal interviews for the open position will be conducted in public session during the June 17 Board of Education meeting located in the Media Center of Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School. Following interviews, existing board members will deliberate, and a candidate will be selected and approved during the same meeting.

Those interested in seeking a 3-year term in November must obtain 25 signatures of qualified voters living in the district, one of which may be your own, to be included on the ballot. Interested individuals can gather support for candidacy by communicating their goals and aims for the schools to the electorate. The election will be held on Nov. 4.
