You are asked to check the box next to the event for which you give consent and return both pages of the permission slip to your child's period one teacher by June 2nd. There will be three items for you to check, indicating your consent. Each student must return a permission slip as they will be leaving the building for Recognition rehearsal. This permission slip is not connected to the PTA donation for the 8th Grade Party.

As a reminder, students receiving an in or out of school suspension, during the school year or has earned a grade average of D+ or lower in any course, will forfeit their privilege to participate in the end of the year trip. The Resort has facilities for any type of weather!

In addition, students will have lunch and an afternoon sweets & treats party at the Resort. Attached is the menu, as well as, the rules for the Resort. We are excited to invite your child to participate in this exciting experience.

Please do not include the donation for the party in your payment.

All students are encouraged to partake in this culminating year-end activity to celebrate their accomplishments and time at Terrill Middle School. Any student not attending the trip is expected to be in school on this day.

On Friday, June 9, 2023, Terrill Middle School will hold its annual Eighth Grade Party. The party will be held in the MPR from 7:00 to 8:30 P.M. The primary purpose of this activity is to have each departing eighth grader enjoy one final evening of camaraderie with their Terrill classmates. The PTA will provide light refreshments. We would like to clarify some questions and misconceptions that inevitably arise each year in regard to the party.

In keeping with our school party policy, **guests are not allowed**. This includes all high school students as well as fifth, sixth, and seventh grade Nettingham and Terrill students.

Formal wear is not required; however, it is a semi - "dressy" occasion. Students should dress comfortably. For example, boys can wear nice slacks and a dress shirt or a polo type shirt. Girls may wear a cocktail type dress or nice pants. All students should wear comfortable shoes, and high heels are not recommended.

Both pages of the attached permission slip must be completed and returned to your child's first period teacher by June 2nd, together with payment for the trip. This permission slip is not connected to the PTA 8th Grade Party donation.

Students who arrive late to school or who request an early dismissal on June 9th will not be allowed to attend the 8th Grade Party.

It is with great pleasure that we invite you to attend the annual *Eighth Grade Awards Assembly* on June 19, 2023 at 9:00 A.M. During this special ceremony, teachers and community members will honor students of the eighth- grade class in a variety of academic and extra-curricular areas. The awards assembly will be held in the TMS Auditorium.

Although all students will not receive an award, we invite all parents to share in this special experience. Please note that students will not be permitted to leave early following the awards assembly.

As we rapidly approach the end of the school year, it gives us great pleasure to invite you to a "**NIGHT OF RECOGNITION**" as we honor our eighth grade students on their completion of Terrill Middle School.

We will hold this event on June 20th at the Perry Tyson Field at the Scotch Plains/Fanwood High School starting at 6:00 P.M. 8th grade students need to be at the High School no later than 5:00 P.M.

Since this is a dignified affair, we ask that students dress accordingly (no sneakers, jeans, t-shirts or shorts). Also, no high heels as they will destroy the turf field. In the past, many of our male students have chosen to wear a necktie and female students have worn skirts or dresses. We want to emphasize that although this is not required, it certainly has added to the significance of the occasion. Our sole purpose is to conduct a Recognition ceremony with a sense of respect, decorum, and proper etiquette. Because the event is being held outdoors, there is no seating capacity limit.

However, if there is inclement weather, we will move the event indoors to the SPFHS Auditorium at the same time. Additionally, in the case of inclement weather, there will be a **2-ticket limit per family**. We know that this process will allow for a comfortable environment in which all families may enjoy the ceremony. In the event of questionable weather, a determination will be made by 12:00 noon on June 20th. Tickets are only needed if the ceremony is moved indoors.

We look forward to seeing you on June 20th to celebrate the accomplishments of the Terrill Middle School eighth graders.

STUDENTS


No large backpacks will be permitted; however, students can bring nylon drawstring
