Dear Scotch Plains-Fanwood community,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the District was notified over the weekend through this morning that two individuals at Scotch Plains-Fanwood HS, an individual at Brunner Elementary, an individual at Evergreen Elementary School, an individual at McGinn Elementary and an individual at Coles Elementary School tested positive for COVID-19.

The District has directly communicated with any individual identified as a close contact with the one case at the HS and they have been advised accordingly. It was confirmed that there were no close contacts regarding the second case at the HS.

Please be advised that the district communicated with any individual identified as a close contact with the case at McGinn Elementary School and the case at Coles Elementary School and they have been advised accordingly.

Please be further advised that the District has confirmed that there are no close contacts in the Brunner or Evergreen Elementary schools and therefore there is no impact on classes for these cases.

It is also important to emphasize that although we continue to identify positive cases we do not have confirmed student-to-student, student-to-staff, staff-to-student, or teacher-to-teacher transmission. This provides compelling evidence that our mitigation strategies are effective.

The District continues to work closely with public health officials in order to assure the health and safety of our community.

I recognize that many of you would like more detailed information about the cases or contacts of the cases. The information I am providing you here has been composed in consultation with and vetted by the Department of Health, and I am not in a position to comment further.

We are confident that the mitigation measures we have in place, such as universal masking, screening procedures, social distancing, enhanced cleaning procedures, and other precautions, will have their intended effect and reduce or minimize the risk of transmission in the school environment. We encourage parents and students to continue following the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention promoted safeguards, such as:

- Staying home when you are sick;
- Washing hands often for at least 20 seconds;
- Covering coughs and sneezes and properly disposing of tissues;
- Limiting close contact with people who are sick and not sharing food, drinks and utensils;
- Practicing social distancing (staying at least 6 feet apart);
- Wearing a face covering while in school;
- Continuing to monitor your health for symptoms;
- Immediately notifying your child's school if they have a positive COVID-19 test result

As always, we appreciate your support and cooperation. Moving forward, you can assist us by remaining vigilant but sensible in your approach to dealing with this health concern. Thank you for your ongoing patience and flexibility as we continue to make our way through this school year.
