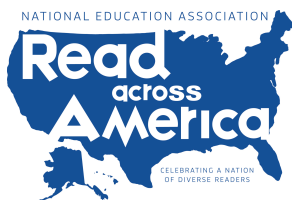

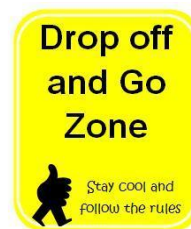


READ ACROSS AMERICA CELEBRATION: On Friday, March 1, we will be celebrating "Read Across America". Dignitaries from our school district and local community will be visiting School One to read to our students. We are honored and privileged that they are dedicating their time to share their love of reading. I am confident our children will enjoy this visit. Research indicates that children do better academically at school when they read outside of the school setting. Please support reading as a life-long activity in your home by

reading to and with your child. Encourage your child to enjoy a good book and engage in reading activities at home on a daily basis.

During the week of February 26th, students will be participating in a "Read Across America Activities". A flyer will be going home with a theme for each day.

MORNING DROP-OFF: We are asking for your cooperation as you drop your children off for school at 8:25. As you approach the school, please stay in the line of traffic. Once you move into the drop-off zone, pull up as far as possible and allow the child(ren) in your vehicle to **depart on the PASSENGER side in a timely manner.** After your child has safely left your car, follow the car in front of you and move cautiously into the street, as soon as possible, so other cars may move forward. Please remain patient so that all children can be dropped off safely. **All drivers MUST stay in their car. If you feel your child is too young to open the door on their own, then we ask you to park in the neighborhood and walk to school.** Thank you.

APPLICATIONS FOR THE SCOTCH PLAINS-FANWOOD PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM:

The Scotch Plains - Fanwood Preschool Program provides a foundation of readiness skills for 3- and 4-year-old children. The preschool program is a tuition-based, regular education program with integrated classes that include some classified student participation. Enrollment is limited to Scotch Plains and Fanwood residents.

Re-enrollment for children currently attending our Preschool Program will take place in February. The enrollment process for new children wishing to enroll for next year will become available in March. 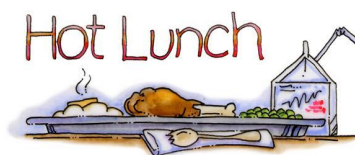

LUNCH PROGRAM (GRADES K – 4): School lunches are \$3.50 and on pizzeria pizza day, an EXTRA slice is \$3.00. A copy of the February menu can be found on the district website. Gluten-free menus are available by request only. Please contact the Main Office if you would like to receive a copy.

For easy service, students should have balances on their PaySchool accounts to purchase lunch from the food service lines. To register for an account, please visit www.payschoolscentral.com. Cash and checks (payable to the Scotch Plains BOE) are accepted. Please be sure to provide an envelope marked with your child's name and "Lunch Money" clearly printed.

Please keep in mind that the school is unable to provide refrigeration for lunches brought from home or heat lunches that students bring to school.
