KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION: Families with kindergarten aged children are asked to please visit our district website at https://www.spfk12.org for information regarding registration, the required forms, and procedures to register.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION: Kindergarten Orientation is scheduled for Wednesday, May 28th, 10:00-11:00 a.m. Families are reminded to make an appointment with the Registration Coordinator to finalize registration.

NEW REGISTRANTS: Parents of children in Grades 1 through 4 who will be enrolling at School One in September and were enrolled in a public, private or parochial school this year are urged to contact the Main Office at this time. This is particularly important for children entering our first-grade program. **Children registering for first grade must be at least 6 years of age on or before October 1, 2025.** If you know of a family in your neighborhood with children entering School One in the fall, please convey this information to them. PUPIL ASSIGNMENT PROCESS: As we begin to plan for the 2025/2026 school year, please keep in mind that students are placed in heterogeneous class sections. Many factors are thoroughly examined and discussed. These include both the students' academic performance in all components of the curriculum, and their social interactions in relationship to peers. We strive to maintain a balance in the classroom. Groupings are developed according to students' study habits and levels of participation during class instruction.

We realize that parents have valuable information to share regarding their children's specific needs. Should there be any special factors you feel are necessary for us to consider, you may express them in writing to the principal's office. Your input will be taken under advisement. We respectfully request that you do NOT request a specific teacher by name. Your support and encouragement regarding your children's assignment will be important in ensuring they have a successful year.

ARE YOU MOVING??? If your child will NOT be attending School One in September, please notify the main office at this time. You may contact the Main Office or email Mrs. O'Brien at cobrien@spfk12.org.

STUDENT ABSENCES: Please remember to notify the school when your child is going to be absent and include your child's name, grade, your child's teacher's name, and a detailed reason for your child's absence. PRE-K MILK MONEY: Pre-K milk money for the month of JUNE will be collected FRIDAY, MAY 9TH, in the amount of \$10.50 (14 days x \$.75). A milk order form will be sent home with your child on Monday, May 5th. Please complete the form and return to school with your payment (either exact change, or a check made payable to SPF BOE) in a sealed envelope. Pre-K students participating in the free-milk program MUST submit an order form.



LUNCH PROGRAM (GRADES K - 4): School lunches are \$3.70 and on pizzeria pizza day, an EXTRA slice is \$3.00. A copy of the May menu can be found on the district website. Gluten-free menus are available by request only. Please contact the Main Office if you would like to receive a copy.

For easy service, students should have balances on their PaySchool accounts to purchase lunch from the food service lines. To register for an account, please visit www.payschoolscentral.com. Cash and checks (payable to the Scotch Plains BOE) are accepted. Please be sure to provide an envelope marked with your child's name and "Lunch Money" clearly printed.

Please keep in mind that the school is unable to provide refrigeration for lunches brought from home or heat lunches that students bring to school.
