Math Competition: 160+ Students Compete



Over 160 Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools students in grades 6-8 competed Jan. 20 in a national math competition hosted by the Mathematical Association of America.

AMC 8 is a 25-question, 40-minute multiple choice mathematics examination for middle school students to test their problem-solving skills. The annual competition allows middle school students to develop positive attitudes toward mathematics and prepare for future careers. The competition also complements the district's mathematics curriculum, which supports critical thinking at all levels and perseverance in solving real-world problems.

Official scores are expected in late February.
