 Mr. Rittner requests to take the SPFHS Academic Environmental Science class (approx. 20 students) in April 2022 to Jockey Hollow Visitor Center (part of Morristown National Historical Park) in Morristown NJ. The Visitor Center is operated by the National Park Service and students will work with staff biologists to participate in the Dragonfly Mercury Project.

This project engages citizen scientists as students and teachers in the collection of juvenile dragonflies for mercury analysis. The goal of this field study is for students to participate in an ecological assessment of their local environment. This will help to cultivate greater environmental stewardship and sense of place for students. They will develop skills in sampling organisms and managing riparian ecosystems.

- Mr. Ducker Duffy and Guida Faria request to take 15 students from grades 9-12 that make up the Raider Robotics Team to Morris Knolls High School in Rockaway NJ on March 6, 2022. The Robotics team has advanced to the state Championship and this is the only event venue for this trip this year.
