This notice is to advise you that the following pesticides will be used on all grass surfaces of **EVERGREEN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, PARK MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL.**

Description of the possible adverse effects of the pesticides as per the Material Safety Data Sheets for the pesticides to be used, if available:

Keep out of the reach of children. Hazard to humans and domestic animals. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin.

Causes eye irritation. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Do not breathe spray mist.

Causes eye irritation. May cause redness, tearing, do not get into eyes.

Harmful if absorbed through the skin. Do not get on skin or clothing. May produce symptoms similar to those from ingestion.

May cause irritation, redness, and swelling.

Harmful if ingested. May cause shortness of breath, drowsiness, involuntary shaking, muscle weakness, convulsions.

Harmful if inhaled. Avoid breathing spray mist. May produce symptoms similar to those from ingestion.

May cause shortness of breath excitement, involuntary shaking and irritability.

Inhalation of product may aggravate existing chronic respiratory problems such as asthma, emphysema or bronchitis.

Pesticide product label instructions and precautions related to Public Safety.

Emergency First Aid Procedures:

General advice:

- First aid personnel should pay attention to their own safety. If the patient is likely to become unconscious, place and transport in stable sideways position (recovery position). Immediately remove contaminated clothing.
- If inhaled: Keep patient calm, remove to fresh air, seek medical attention.
- If on skin: Immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, seek medical attention.
- If in eyes: Wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open.
- If swallowed: Immediately rinse mouth and then drink 200-300 ml of water, seek medical attention.
