COMMUNITY

Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School serves the suburban residential communities of Scotch Plains and Fanwood. These two high income communities, twenty-six miles west of Manhattan have a combined population of about 30,000.

SCHOOL

Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School, with an enrollment of 1565 students, is a four-year comprehensive public high school operating under a single curriculum. Five elementary schools and two middle schools feed directly into the district's only high school. Each student's program, through individualized scheduling and ability grouping, is tailored to their aptitudes and interests.

ACCREDITATION

Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the New Jersey Department of Education.

FACULTY

The professional staff includes 121 teachers, counselors, and librarians/media specialists. There are seven fulltime counselors and one student assistance counselor, who counsel students in academic, career and personal matters. The counseling staff is supported by a district supervisor of counseling and the director of special services.

STUDENTS

Scotch Plains-Fanwood students actively participate in school life on a broad academic and co-curricular level:

- More than 50 co-curricular activities are offered in addition to 21 varsity athletic teams. There are an additional 25 junior varsity or freshman level athletic teams.
- Students produce a yearbook, literary magazine, television programs, and a monthly student-run newspaper.
- The annual yearbook wins numerous awards for presentation and content.
- High quality vocal and instrumental programs have enabled students to participate in multiple and varied all-state choirs, national, state, and regional competitions.
- An active Student Government Association works with administration to plan and implement school activities and to discuss school climate.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School, Class of 2024, must accumulate a total of 120 credits and successfully complete the following requirements to qualify for a diploma:

- Four credit years of English
- Three credit years of math
- Three credit years of natural or physical science
- Three credit years of social studies
- Two credit years of world language (must be same language)
- One credit year of physical education & health for each year of enrollment
- One credit year of practical arts
- One credit year of visual and performing arts.
- One half credit year of financial literacy integrated within the curriculum.
- Technology integrated throughout curriculum.
- Meet New Jersey State standardized testing requirements.

CURRICULUM

Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School offers a comprehensive program for students with a strong focus on college preparatory courses. More that 150 courses are offered during an alternating block, eight-period schedule, including courses in business, fine arts, music, practical arts, as well as the core curriculum centered on language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, and world languages. Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School offers 22 distinct Advanced Placement courses, as well as accelerated courses offered in each of the core disciplines. The needs of all students are addressed through programs in practical arts, computer science, performing and visual arts, and business education. Additionally, interested students are able to attend Union County Career and Technical Institute on a shared-time basis.

ACCELERATED AND ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School offers 22 Advanced Placement courses. Advanced Placement courses are typically taken during junior and senior years due to state graduation requirements and district prerequisites for admission. All Advanced Placement courses related to science have class limits of 24 students due to physical plant limitations, as well as limits to the teaching staff. In the spring of 2023, 413 students were administered 771 Advanced Placement exams; 77.5% of the students who took AP exams scored a "3" or higher.
