A Message From the Superintendent

**Dear Scotch Plains–Fanwood
Community,**

Tomorrow marks a pivotal moment for Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools and the students, staff, families, and communities we are privileged to serve. Opportunities like this are rare. It's uncommon for a school building to come up for sale precisely when we need more space for our students. It's even more extraordinary for the state to offer \$11.4 million to support critical HVAC, electrical, and fire alarm upgrades across all our schools.



As the proud superintendent of Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools, I've witnessed firsthand how much this community values and takes pride in our district. This shared commitment to education is why so many families are drawn here – and more students in our schools means we need more space.

The day-to-day reality cannot be ignored: we don't have enough classroom space for programs, we hold additional lunch periods causing children to eat early or late, and critical services and small group instruction taking place in shared spaces.

Since the vote in September, the Board of Education and I went back to the drawing board, and in collaboration with a citizen advisory group, developed a revised, scaled-back plan. The new proposal significantly reduces the costs for taxpayers, while still capturing \$11.4 million in state aid. And, while this new plan doesn't solve every issue, it represents a meaningful step forward, at a cost of approximately \$21-\$24 per month for the average assessed home in Scotch Plains and Fanwood.

This is a chance for Scotch Plains and Fanwood residents to shape the future of our schools and communities. Please remember to vote tomorrow, Tuesday, Jan. 28; polls are open from 2-8 p.m. Mail-in ballots must also be postmarked by that date. SPFHS Model United Nations Students Earn Top Awards

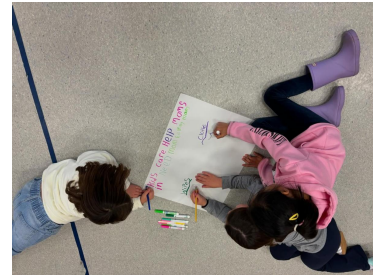
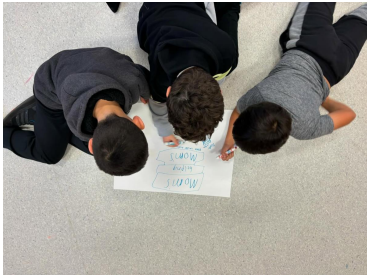
