Course Name: Grade 2 Music

Course #: E6212

Course Description:

All second-grade students receive one class period of instruction per week providing opportunities to learn about the elements of music through singing, listening, playing, creating, moving to, and beginning to read notation.

Course Proficiencies: The following is a list of the proficiencies which students are expected to know and be able to do as a result of successfully completing this course. The proficiencies are the basis of the assessment of student achievement. The learner will demonstrate the ability to:

- 1. Sing culturally diverse songs from around the world using the basic elements of music. 1.2.2.A.1, 1.2.2.A.2, 1.3.2.B.1, 1.3.2.B.2

Assessment:

Formative and summative assessments will be used to identify if proficiencies are met. These include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Aural assessment of vocal technique, pitch.
- 2. Students will also begin to evaluate their own individual and group performances in music class.
- 3. Visual assessment of correct playing/performing of rhythmic and melodic patterns.
