Course Name: Grade 4 Music

Course #: E6412

Course Description:

All fourth-grade students receive one class period of instruction per week providing opportunities to learn about the elements of music through singing, listening, playing, creating, moving to, and reading notation.

Course Proficiencies: The following is a list of the proficiencies which students are expected to know and be able to do as a result of successfully completing this course. The proficiencies are the basis of the assessment of student achievement. The learner will demonstrate the ability to:

Assessment:

Formative and summative assessments will be used to identify if proficiencies are met. These include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Visual/aural assessment of the vocal technique
- 2. Aural identification of major/minor tonalities and timbre of instruments
- 3. Creation of melodic and/or rhythmic compositions
- 4. Students will continue to evaluate their own performances in music as well as evaluating the performance of others
