

Course Name: Grade 7 Instrumental Techniques

Course #: M6742

Course Description:

All instrumental music students must take a one period lesson per week/cycle on their instrument in order to take part in one or more of the larger ensembles. Instrumental Techniques offers students the opportunity to learn and master their instruments in a more individualized setting. Lesson groups meet on a rotating schedule each week/cycle so the student does not miss an excessive number of classes per marking period.
