Course Name: Grade 3 Elementary Art

Course #: E6302

Course Description:

The Third Grade Art program is designed to provide students with the opportunity to further their understanding and appreciation of the visual arts while also developing their expressive and creative problem-solving skills. Students participate in weekly lessons that are 40 minutes in duration. Students study the topics of aesthetics, the elements, and principles of design, critique, world cultures, art history and society and the creation of artwork. The regular display of student work throughout the school buildings provides a vehicle for communicating individual and collective talents.
